Physical and mental aspects of self care in cancer patients referred to Shiraz Namazi Hospital Chemotherapy

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Abstract

Being diagnosed with cancer can be an overwhelming experience for people with cancer and their loved ones. Both the disease and it' treatment causes a variety of symptoms.

This research was done with the overall purpose of assessing cancer patients knowledge about men (""cases). The mean age of patients was £7. Ayears with a range from 17 to 49 years. The most frequent incidence was in the illiterate population with £7.4% (75 cases) and only 4.7% (1) cases) had university educations. 75.9% (% cases) was housewives and only 7.7% (% cases) was students. The married subjects was $\Lambda \xi.\%$ (117 cases) and $\xi V.\Lambda\%$ (19 cases) and been diagnosed with breast cancer. The following visit varied from 1 to 11 times. 11.1% (TV cases) and single chemotherapy program and $\sqrt{7.5}\%$ (9\forall cases) had combined chemotherapy. $\sqrt{1.1}\%$ bout it^s importance. o7.7% (Y·cases) had low level of knowledge about chemotherapy complications. \circ 7% ($^{\vee}$ 1 cases) did not have certain sources to take information and in $^{\vee}$ 1.7% (° cases) source of information was physician. Physical Care score was about 7 to 17 with mean A.A and psychological care score was about 7 to 7. with mean 10. There was a statistically significant result between physical care score and education (p<·.··٤) and following visits (p<...) According to this research results cancer patient education about self care is very important and also these results emphasize on nurses attention to these programs.

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
